Te Ara Poutama (TAP) living well with heart disease is a kaupapa Māori integrated research module co-funded by Pūtahi Manawa -Healthy Hearts for Aotearoa New Zealand Centre of Research Excellence and the National Heart Foundation of New Zealand. TAP is a hapori/community-based Māori led heart health research programme which will be foundational for developing culturally grounded approaches to equitable heart health.

It involves 3 parallel integrated kaupapa Māori research projects.

1. Pou Ako – Training centre.
2. Pou Mahi ā Hapori Kaupapa Māori Co-Design.
3. Pou Pūtaiao hapori-based bilingual Māori heart survey and health checks.

Purpose

The internship aim to provide opportunities for Māori tauira studying health at a tertiary level to participate in a kaupapa Māori designed and led heart health research programme of work. The tauira will have an interest to develop their skills, knowledge and networks and to contribute to the wider kaupapa of supporting our whānau hapū and iwi on their heart health journey. The 9 week internship will involve participation in a week long wānanga followed by an 8 week heart health project that will be supervised by heart health researchers and clinicians.

For 2023/24 the Kura Raumati internship opportunities come with a stipend of \$9000.

The internship starts with a wānanga in Tai Rāwhiti where we will be immersed in learning about mātauranga Māori approaches to heart health.

This will be the opportunity for:

- Whakawhanauangatanga
- Learning about Kaupapa Māori research methodologies
- Connecting with leading Heart health researchers and shaping the research projects for the next 8 weeks.

Following this taura will begin their 8 week internship alongside their supervisors and community mentors. On completion of the 8 weeks taura will come together once again to present their findings and to celebrate their successes with the wider heart health whānau and communities.

Expectations

- Taura must be committed to the internship for the full nine weeks including attending both the beginning and end wānanga.

We will provide

- Travel to and from Te Tai Rāwhiti (marae to be confirmed).
- Costs to attend both wānanga. (Flights if needed)
- Pūtea of \$9000 for each successful taura.
- Kaiawhina support throughout the duration of the internship.
